The Intouchables is a French film released in 2011 and directed by Olivier Nakache and Éric Toledano. It quickly became the second biggest box office hit in France and the biggest outside France. It narrates the encounter of Driss (Omar Sy), a young man from the parisian suburbs faking a caregiver career to take advantage of unemployment benefits, and Philippe (François Cluzet), a paraplegic aristocrat. Their relationship is at first rough and difficult, but a great complicity develops between the two men.

Haute Cuisine is a French comedy released in 2012 and directed by Christian Vincent, inspired by a true story. Hortense Laborie (Catherine Frot), a renowned chef from Périgord, is astonished when the President of the Republic (played by the very French Jean d'Ormesson) appoints her his personal cook, responsible for creating all his meals at the Élysée Palace. Despite jealous resentment from the other kitchen staff, Hortense quickly establishes herself, thanks to her indomitable spirit. The authenticity of her cooking soon seduces the President, but the corridors of power are littered with traps.

French Dual Fund - Now accepting applications for the 2018 Call for Projects DEADLINE September 17th 2018

This call is ONLY for American K-12 public schools offering French dual language and immersion programs
(Milton, Holliston, Brockton districts for New England)

Each year, we invite teachers and administrators of American K-12 public schools, school districts, and state agencies who manage French dual language and immersion programs to apply for a grant in the amount of \$1,000 to \$10,000 to support a specific project aimed at promoting the objectives of the Fund. The projects address one of the following four program areas:

- 1 - Creating or developing a francophone environment in your school (for example, purchase of books, DVDs, CDs, or games for the francophone section of your school library OR organization of a francophone event such as film screenings, workshops with children's or young adult authors, theater clubs, and more.)
- 2 - Adapted pedagogical material for the classroom (for example, curriculum supports such as software, DVDs, subscription to TV5, etc. for your French class or subject matter class adapted for French immersion, and more.)
- 3 - Professional development for teachers (for example, sending teachers to France to the CLA or CIEP, sending teachers to the CARLA summer institute,

or supporting the facilitation of workshops with experts identified by the district or the school, and more.)

4 - Initial training or professional development for administrators (for example, participation by an administrator in a CARLA summer institute, supporting the school to invite external experts or consultants to provide council on development of the bilingual program, and more.)

French Immersion Day at University of Maine at Augusta

Tuition is \$75 for students and \$85 for adults. This includes meals and snacks, as well as all instruction and materials. Teachers will receive CEUs.

A core group of French language immersion teachers is planning an all-day immersion program for Saturday, September 29, 2018, from 8:30 am until approximately 9:00 pm on the campus of the University of Maine at Augusta. This French-language learning program is a total immersion experience for intermediate- to advanced-level high school and college students, French teachers, and interested adults who are seeking the challenge of a 100% French-speaking environment. During the immersion day, instructors will give participants a choice of activities targeting different levels—all designed to encourage conversation and develop participants' abilities in spoken French. Staff will include three Native-speaking exchange students attending UMA from l'Université de Bretagne in Brest, France, who will share aspects of their daily lives as college students living in Western France. Organizer Schulz said, "Participants can expect to have fun and learn a lot as they practice French outside of the traditional classroom in a relaxed environment." HURRY UP - TARA WILL BE SOON IN BOSTON!



The crew is inviting students and teachers aboard to share Tara's discoveries

Tara, a mythical schooner, designed and built in 1989 on the initiative of the French explorer Jean-Louis Etienne, is a research vessel designed for polar conditions and able to withstand the pressure of pack ice on its hull. For 507 days in 2006 to 2008, Tara remained intentionally locked in the ice in order to research climate change in the Arctic. Tara has also voyaged across all the oceans of the world to study plankton, coral reefs, and plastic pollution.

During these expeditions Tara stops in many countries. The next stopover will be Boston, MA. The crew invites students and their teachers aboard to share

Tara's discoveries and adventures. Young people can visit the entire boat with a sailor, scientist or mediator.


